These four “KEYS” provide a framework and direction for curriculum throughout this training season.

will somehow connect with one of the KEYS. We began the training season at our WILD Weekends, where we focused on the first key, Kingdom Authority (specifically our roles as ambassadors in God’s kingdom).

KINGDOM AUTHORITY. Here we consider the question: Whose Kingdom is it? The focus of this key is our relationships with Christ. *“The earth is the LORD’s, and everything in it, the world, and all who live in it” Ps 24:1. “But seek first his kingdom and his righteousness, and all these things will be given to you as well”*



EMBRACING our IDENTITIES. Here we consider the question: What’s under your armor? (As all knights know – armor is custom fit). The focus of this key is the individual...personal growth and maturity (who I am and who I am becoming). *“For we are God’s handiwork, created in Christ Jesus to do good works, which God prepared in advance for us to do” Eph 2:10. “I praise you because I am fearfully and wonderfully made; your works are wonderful, I know that full well” Ps 139:14.*



YIELDING to the SPIRIT. Here we consider the question: How can we be an effective army? The focus of this key is the corporate life...unity in the body. As we yield to the Holy Spirit, He brings unity and harmony. *“And in him you too are being built together to become a dwelling in which God lives by his Spirit” Eph 2:22 (also see vs. 19-21). “I have given them the glory that you gave me, that they may be one as we are one - I in them and you in me - so that they may be brought to complete unity. Then the world will know that you sent me and have loved them even as you have loved me” (John 17:22-23).*



SETTING people FREE. Here we consider the question: What needs to be done...what is our mission? *“So if the Son sets you free, you will be free indeed” (John 8:36). The focus of this key is service...reaching out. “You, my brothers and sisters, were called to be free. But do not use your freedom to indulge the flesh; rather, serve one another humbly in love” Gal 5:13. “Let us not become weary in doing good, for at the proper time we will reap a harvest if we do not give up” Gal 6:9.*
